Dean's letter, Sunday, 6th March 2016

Dear Cathedral family,

A very sincere thank you to all who responded so generously to Revd Claire's appeal for help with the CSM/Ansoc student camp, which is on the go this weekend (they return later this morning). At the time of writing, we have just under 30 students who signed up, and we are hopeful that this will have risen to 30 by the weekend. What a privilege it is to be connected to these young lives and by God's grace to nurture and encourage their life and growth in Christ during these crucial years at university. We continue to hold all our universities in prayer during these volatile times. So much is at stake. The "fallism" movement which is emerging, and which seeks the downfall of all and any structures which are deemed to be in any way oppressive, has its merits, but also its dangers of violence, destruction, and extremist attitudes and behaviour.

A Marxist analysis of society sees conflict and revolution as an essential step in the process that will lead to the ideal, class-less society; experiences of revolution in other parts of the world suggest otherwise. The Christian world view sees all our work and our efforts as part of the kingdom or rule of God. God in Christ came to set us free from sin and evil and death, and to empower us to live lives of love and service, joy and worship – and to witness by word and deed to the reign and rule of Christ. This certainly includes engaging with issues of economic inequality, poverty, unemployment, historic and structural injustice, racism, prejudice, power, oppression – but from a deep knowledge of God's love for all people, and the invitation and challenge to "throw off every encumbrance and the sin that all too readily restricts us, and run with resolution the race which lies ahead of us, our eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith." (Hebrews 12:1). And let's not forget the two Great Commandments: to love the Lord our God with all our hearts, minds and strength; and to love our neighbour as we love ourselves.

Next Sunday, 13th March, is our Annual Vestry Meeting. There will be a single combined act of worship that morning, starting at 08h30 (our student service will be at 19h00 as usual) and the Vestry meeting itself will be held in St George's Hall, starting soon after the morning service. I shall deliver the Dean's Vestry Report in the context of the Eucharist. All reports, including the financial report and the churchwardens' report, should be available at the back of the church, today, Sunday 6th March.

Please attend the Vestry meeting. This is a crucial event in the life of the Cathedral, as we look back over the past year, and elect lay leadership – churchwardens and parish councillors - for the year ahead. Vestry will also be electing Synod representatives, for our Diocesan Synod to be held in East London, from $3^{\text{rd}} - 6^{\text{th}}$ May 2016 (*Please note that these dates have changed*).

Our Annual Vestry Meeting will be held next Sunday 13th March, in St George's Hall, after a combined 08h30 service. Please remember that you may not vote at the meeting unless you are at least 18 years old and a communicant member on the parish roll. Remember, too, that because you may have once been on the roll it does not necessarily mean that you still are. Contact Wayne Jayes (046 622 8623) or the parish secretary (046 622 2445) with any queries. Should you be unable to attend the meeting you are welcome to tender your apologies in advance; there is a form on a clipboard for this purpose on the glass cabinet.

Nominations at Vestry: Those who wish to propose or second a candidate for the positions of churchwarden, alternate churchwarden and Parish Councillors must be Cathedral members in good standing, in line with the requirements of Canon 27.2 and Article XXIV (10) of the ACSA Constitution. Anyone being nominated for any of these offices must also be a Cathedral member in good standing. Those being nominated for PCC must be 18 and older (Canon 29.3); those being nominated for churchwarden or alternate churchwarden must be 21 or older - Canon 29.1. The incumbent (in our case, the Dean) has the right of veto over the election of a churchwarden - Canon 29.2. As has been done previously, those nominating will be asked at Vestry to say briefly why they are nominating a particular candidate. Nomination forms are on the glass cabinet.

Draft motions for the Vestry meeting must reach the parish office by 12 noon on Monday 7th March, and will need the approval of the Dean and PCC, in line with Canon 27 (7), before they can be included in the agenda.

The **Lent course**: *Jewels from John*, a journey of exploration of St John's "unique and extraordinary gospel", continues in the Chapter House on Wednesday evenings during Lent It is led by Revd Claire Nye Hunter. Time: 18h30 – 19h30. Dates: 2nd, 9th, 16th and 23rd March.

The usual service of Choral Evensong on the 2nd Sunday of the month (13th March) has been cancelled, due to the **Easter Cantate** being planned for Tuesday 15th and Wednesday 16th March, at 19h00, in the Cathedral. Our choir, together with the choirs of SAC and DSG, will be participating in the Cantate.
